## Contractor dies in Bailey Yard incident Saturday

A 42-year-old North Platte man died in an incident at Bailey Yard on Saturday morning.

According to Justin Jacobs, a spokesman with Union Pacific Railroad, the incident occurred about 9 a.m. on the grounds of the railyard west of North Platte. The person involved worked for a contract company that UP uses, Jacobs said.

Chief Lincoln County Sheriff's deputy Roland Kramer confirmed the incident, saying the cause of death was still under investigation on Saturday, and that he expected to have more information about the incident at a later date. He did not release the name of the man.

Patrol Spokesman, Cody Thomas, says Ziel was driving the fuel truck. Ziel was out of the truck as it was fueling, and the truck ran over him. Thomas says they don't know why the truck was moving.
